We have produced this guide to various factors involved in choosing walkie-talkie radios for use in schools.

“Licensable” and “Licence-Free” Radios – What’s The Difference?

In the UK, use of most walkie-talkie radios requires some type of government licence, issued by Ofcom (the “Office of Communications”).

“Licence-free” walkie-talkies can legally have a lower power output ($\frac{1}{2}$ watt) than “licensable” radios (usually 3, 4 or 5 watts).

So, “licence-free” walkie-talkies will have a lower maximum range and lower signal penetration through walls inside buildings than the “licensable” radios.

Licence-free walkie-talkies are generally cheaper to buy than licensable ones.

Licence-free walkie-talkies are often referred to as “PMR446” radios. “PMR446” is the name of the legal standard that all licence-free radios must comply with. Often the model names of these radios involve the

Licence-free walkie-talkies will often work around smaller school buildings, bigger buildings (or multiple buildings on a school site) may require the more powerful radios to transmit the radio signals all over the site.

A basic Ofcom licence costs only £75, lasts for five years, and you only need one licence per school, not per radio.

If your school buys “licensable” radios from us, and if you want us to do so, we will apply for your licence with Ofcom on your behalf.

Cheap or Expensive? Why Do Some Radios Cost So Much More Than Others?

Generally, what you pay more for is better “build quality” and robustness.

How much you want to spend will depend on how much you have (obviously!) but also on how you plan to use walkie-talkies.

If they are going to be used all day, every day, then you will want something a bit more “heavy duty” than if they are only used for 1 hour a day for lunchtime supervision, say, or if they only get used for fire drills etc.

Also, some of our radios are, to differing degrees, water-resistant or even completely water-proof.

This may be important if they are to be used on the sports field, on school trips, or by a swimming pool etc.

Finally, you may also decide that it makes sense to buy lots of cheap radios for the same budget as fewer top-class ones, in terms of what you get, but also in terms of not being so bothered if one was to get dropped, broken, lost etc.
